"Train Wreck at Woodruff Pass"

Objective: Identify items needed for first aid in the event of a catastrophe; identify items for Scout Outdoor Essentials.

Judging: This event will be judged on the accurate response to a set of questions providing first aid and scouting situations. Points will be awarded for each correct answer. Tiebreaker will be total items identified correctly.

Materials: Tarps will be used to cover the items before and after viewing. There will be a maximum of four viewing areas each containing a duplicate set of items. Items considered will be: plastic tarp, matches, staves, wood planks, blanket, sheet, first aid cream, sterile bandages (gauze), tape, Tylenol/aspirin/pain reliever, soap, ace bandage, triangular bandage, nylon rope, newspaper, water, insect repellent, alcohol, pocket knife, axe/hatchet, sun screen, trail food, water bottle, belt, mirror, cup, whistle, flashlight, water purification tablet, candle, clothes, first aid kit, emergency blanket, twine, saw, Vaseline, lighter, watch, compass, rain gear

Goal: Utilizing a Kim's game approach, patrol members will be placed around several roped off areas and allowed to view the items for thirty seconds before they are re-covered. As a patrol they will attempt to remember the items and utilize them as necessary to provide first aid for specific cases and for Scout Outdoor Essentials. It involves all members of the patrol and requires that they work together to reach a consensus solution.

Game Setup Scenario: The patrol is part of a sightseeing trip aboard a vintage coal burning train trip into the wilderness area surrounding the Great Woodruff Mountains. It has been snowing heavily over the past several weeks. A sudden avalanche derails the train. There are four victims suffering from various injuries.

- Station 1: Victim suffering from severe laceration on the lower arm bleeding profusely.
- Station 2: Victim with broken upper leg.
- Station 3: Victim unconscious breathing irregular.
- Station 4: Victim suffering second and third degree burns on legs and arms
- Station 5: Identify the order in which you would treat these victims for cases 1 4.
- Station 6: Identify10 items that are considered Scout Outdoor Essentials.

Tasks: Identify as many items as they can remember.

Identify items to be used for the four first aid situations. The items cannot be used but once.

Identify the order that victims will be treated.

Identify ten items that are considered as Scout Outdoor Essentials.
